

Take the FIRST STEP to Fitness in Prosper!

The Mayor of Prosper issues 100-mile and 500-mile fitness challenges. A downsized version of the adage, attributed to Chinese philosopher Lao Tzu that a journey of a thousand miles begins with one step certainly applies to the 2020 Mayor's Fitness Challenge.

With that first step? Challenge participants can begin notching miles by walking, jogging, running or biking, toward meeting either the Challenge's goals or by surpassing the minimums and meeting their own personal stretch goals. Official tracking ends at midnight on Wednesday, April 15.

As before, Prosper residents who complete and submit a tracking sheet by the deadline, Monday, April 20, and who complete a minimum of 100 miles afoot, or 500 miles riding self-propelled, will be recognized at a Town Council meeting, receive a complimentary T-shirt, and have a chance at winning a Fitbit watch.

"If one of your New Year's Resolutions was to get in shape, this year's Challenge is a tremendous way to start. There are few things more important than good health," says Mayor Ray Smith. "I encourage residents to form walking, jogging, running, or biking groups. That way, we can hold each other accountable. I'll be logging my miles, and I hope to see my neighbors and friends doing the same thing."

Online registration is now open at www. prosperparksandrec.org. There are two ways to keep track of miles, electronically or on paper. A fillable tracking sheet can be downloaded from the website to participants' computers or mobile devices and miles can be posted electronically. Or, the tracking sheet can be printed for logging miles manually. Paper copies of the tracking sheet can be obtained at either Town Hall, 250 W. First Street or at Parks and Recreation, 409 E. First Street.

"The Parks and Recreation Department challenges everyone to get outside and enjoy a Prosper park during the Challenge," says Dudley Raymond, Director of Parks and Recreation. "The hike and bike trails in Town are ready and waiting for you!"

Updates on the Mayor's Fitness Challenge will be placed on the Town of Prosper Parks and Recreation Facebook page. Participants are encouraged to share adventures on their social media accounts. The 407 **Rec Center** announces new spring classes

The first three classes of what officials anticipate will become a bounty of new offerings at Prosper's 407 Rec Center are scheduled to debut during the year's first quarter, providing mental stimulation and physical exercise for adults and youngsters.

The 407 Rec Center, 407 E. First St., offers Oodles of Doodles; Chess for All; and Flex Yoga for Adults. Registration is now open at www. prosperparksandrec.org for all classes. The website contains full program descriptions, starting and ending dates, and times for these and all recreational opportunities.

"Prosper opened The 407 Rec Center last August as the Town's first space dedicated to Parks and Recreation programs," says Director of Parks and Recreation Dudley Raymond. "Since then, new activities have been added regularly and we'll continue this trend throughout 2020, including after school options for youth and expanded innovative activities for adults."

Oodles of Doodles is a new type of art class designed to spark creativity and relaxation while increasing hand-eye coordination and concentration. Participants will create beautiful art to display at home or share with others. Led by certified instructor Sue Haberer, the onehour class will start at 9:30 a.m. each Thursday between from now and Feb. 20.

Chess for All is designed for youngsters between six and 14 years of age. Instructor and coach Glenn Baumann, who hails from the North Texas Chess Academy, will teach strategy and serve as supervisor for competitive play. Chess has been found to increase problem solving skills, improve memory and concentration, and teach planning and foresight. The one-hour sessions start at 5:30 p.m. on Tuesdays from Feb. 11 through April 14.

Flex Yoga for Adults is a gentle version of the ancient art, providing all the health benefits of traditional yoga. Designed for adults wishing to improve balance, flexibility, concentration, strength and reduce stress, it will be led by Patty Scheibmeir, a Certified Chair Yoga instructor with 200 hours of teacher training from North Texas Yoga. Classes run one hour on Wednesdays starting at 9:30 a.m. from Feb. 12 to March 11.



Put Pown Some Loots Plant a Tree!





You can plant a tree as long as the ground isn't frozen, so basically "always" around here. It is best to get trees planted in the fall or winter so they have time to put down some roots and get established before the scorched

earth summer arrives. Even native and well-adapted trees need a little extra care (i.e. supplemental water) the first two-three years while they get established.

Trees are terrific, especially in the urban environment. We know they produce oxygen – which we just can't live without. And they absorb carbon dioxide, as well as trapping other things like noise, dust and smoke. Trees provide shade, windbreaks, prevent soil erosion and help reduce the heat island of our urban centers. Trees are also lovely and valuable additions to a landscape. According to the Council of Tree and Landscape Appraisers, a mature tree can add from \$1,000 to \$10,000 to the value of your home. And from my own experience, planting a tree is much easier than renovating a bathroom or kitchen.

Here's something else that might surprise

you. Studies show that small trees establish faster and grow more rapidly than larger trees. There are several factors involved such as how the tree was grown (in a container or dug up) but in general larger trees go through a bit of shock and take longer to establish. Some studies have shown that the smaller trees ultimately result in larger trees in the landscape in a few years. This is great news if you don't have a big budget or like digging big holes. However, I know many homeowner associations (HOAs) and city ordinances have certain requirements for tree size, so some of you may not have the option to start small.

If you can go small, have I got a deal for you! It's time for the Denton County Soil and Water Conservation District (SWCD) seedling tree sale. This is a great opportunity to get affordable trees for a good cause. All proceeds benefit the "Cool Shade for Third Grade" program in Denton county schools. "Cool Shade for Third Grade" happens in October. Master Gardeners hand deliver around 2800 seedling trees to third graders across the county along with a short educational presentation. Such a win-win-win situation: children learning about the importance of trees, children having the opportunity to nurture their own tree and you get a bargain on a tree! A special thank you to Upper Trinity Regional Water District for also supporting our "Cool Shade for Third Grade" project!

Orders for the trees are being taken now and are filled on a first come, first serve basis. You must pick up your trees on Friday, February 28, 2020 at the North Texas Fairgrounds between 9 am to 1 pm. To place an order, stop by the Denton County Soil & Water Conservation District office at 525 South Loop 288 Suite C-1 in Denton or call 940 – 383-2691 extension 3. We also have order forms available at our office.

Excellent shade tree choices this year are bur oak, live oak, Mexican white oak and Shumard oak in one gallon containers. Also available in one gallons are some mediumsized, blooming trees: desert willow, Mexican plum and vitex. All of these trees do really well in our area and the one gallon container trees are \$ 9.50 each.

You can pick up a bare root pecan tree for \$2.50 each. If you are interested in an evergreen conifer, the Austrian pine, pinyon pine and Afghanistan pine are available in a six to twelve inch container for \$4.00 each. Also, at that same size and cost you can choose a redbud or catalpa. Get a Creepy, Crawly Collection!

Join the Hagerman for an Introduction to Entomology. Introductions will be held on Saturday, February 8th and March 14th, 11:30 to 12:30, at Hagerman

National Wildlife Refuge located at 6465 Refuge Road, Sherman, TX 75092.

In 2020 HNWR will continue to expand its natural science education effort through the collection of insects on the refuge. The insects will be added to an ongoing curation and exhibition program that will highlight the diversity of insect species found on the refuge.

For those interested in collecting insects for this project, an introduction to entomology will be offered after the second Saturday presentation on February 8th from 11:30 –12:30. On March 14, another lecture will be offered, again following the second Saturday presentation, detailing how to collect, prepare, and curate insects.

After these two presentations, we'll start collecting bugs in the field throughout the spring, summer, and early fall. The program will be sponsored by the Bluestem Master Naturalist Chapter, presented and coordinated by Texas Master Naturalist and Master Entomologist David Parsons.

When you visit, you'll enjoy a picturesque winding drive from the main highway directly to the winery parking. Once inside, you will find the high ceilings of the tasting room complete with a gallery wall featuring local artists. You'll likely be greeted by Vintner Jeanette or her mom,

perhaps her son (and Chef) Mack – unless he's in the Food Truck preparing something fabulous.


The numbered golf balls will be dropped out of a CoServ bucket truck at 4:30 p.m. on the 28th. The ball closest to the Aubrey ISD flag is the winner. The winner will receive an envelope with a number inside. If the number matches the number on the winning ball, that person will receive the \$10,000 grand prize in addition to the first place prize.

The first place winner receives a \$1250 gift card plus a \$1250 grant will be awarded to the Aubrey ISD teacher of the winner's choice. The second place winner will receive a \$500 gift card plus a \$500 grant to the teacher of the winner's choice. The third place winner will receive a \$250 gift card and a \$250 grant goes to the teacher of the winner's choice.

For many years, Prosper residents have strongly held on to the belief that the presence of a public lending library was essential to the overall wellbeing of the community.

As an undeniable testament to that belief, today's Prosper Library holds a special place in the heart of the community. Anchored at Town Hall, 200 S. Main, the fully-accredited facility is staffed with credentialed professionals providing services to residents, students, and visitors.

Debuting an expanded schedule at the start of 2020, it is now open Monday through Thursday from 9:30 a.m. to 7 p.m., on Saturday from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m., and on Sunday from noon to 3 p.m.

Patronage has been steadily increasing. Last year alone, the library's 5,600 card holders performed some 107,000 check outs, either on the over 22,000 physical items or the 35,000 digital items in the library's collections. Many, of course, checked out items in both categories. Taken together, the monetary value of the current collection is estimated to be \$436,309.

Programs for teens, toddlers, and adults are constantly offered, last year totaling over 430. Averaging about 36 a month, the various programs boasted an attendance of nearly 9,500. During the highly popular summer reading challenge, students devoured almost 5,000 titles.

Because books, videos, DVDs, launchpads, audio books and computers are available for use with a membership, library patrons who avail themselves of the material avoid the direct cost of purchasing these items.

Library officials keep track of the direct monetary value of each transaction and can demonstrate the actual costs being avoided by library patronage. These cost avoidances are further categorized by specific reading preference.

For example, during 2019, readers of non-fiction books saved almost \$45,000 by avoiding the cost of purchasing their reading material and borrowing the books from the library. In the Young Adult category, the savings to readers by borrowing rather than purchasing was about \$50,000.

By far, however, the largest category for 2019 was in Juvenile offerings. Combined, the eight subcategories of Juvenile literature represented a cost avoidance of nearly \$940,000.

In all, borrowers in the 30 categories avoided spending \$1,411,137. For Prosper residents, saving close to \$1.5 million by visiting and patronizing the library is enough validation for their long-held belief in the value of a public library.

Laissez les bons temps rouler! WITH A CAJUN BOILING POT

Once crawfish season starts in late February it is a great time in the 380 Corridor to have friends over for a Cajun style seafood boil. If you don't have a taste for mudbugs a simple crab boil will do.

Just cover your patio table with recycled newspapers and pour out the steaming goodness. No plates needed, just a roll of paper towels, some crab mallets or crackers and plenty of yummy libations. Let the good times roll with laughter and plenty of spontaneous conversation while getting your hands messy peeling shrimp, cracking crabs and gnawing corn straight off the cob.

The glorious thing about a boiling pot is that you can make enough just for your family or a giant gathering. Just add more or less of each ingredient to accommodate your needs. It is difficult to go wrong. The ingredient list is just a guideline and

flexibility of types of crab, sausages and onions makes it easy to put your own spin on things.

> To get started, you need fresh corn on the cob cut in half, red potatoes, yellow onions, shrimp, sausage, crab legs, salt, cayenne, garlic and crawfish if you like.

Bring a large pot of water to a boil with Old Bay Crab Boil; add potatoes, sausages, onions, corn, and garlic. Cook mixture at a boil until the potatoes are cooked through, about 30 minutes.

Gently drop crabs, shrimp (and other desired shellfish) into the boiling mixture; cook until the shellfish is cooked through, at least 10 minutes.

Drain water and serve.

Once the boil is devoured the cleanup is as easy as gathering up the newspaper and the shells on top and throwing it into the bin. Laissez les bons temps rouler!
